After all, he spent days and nights at sea listening to cassettes of his parents' favorite musicians such as Joni Mitchell and Jimmy Cliff. His sister Heather Nova, also a musician, taught him the guitar on the sailboat. After spending 1991 and 1992 representing Bermuda in the windsurfing world championships, he turned to music and enjoyed success in the United Kingdom before setting his sights on conquering America. In 2006, he signed to Matthew McConaughey's record label, and this past March he released the successful "Talk About," which featured none other than Willie Nelson accompanying him on the song "Homegrown." Although he was the first signee to McConaughey's label, he knew it was a risk worth taking. "It was a bit of a gamble, but everything in the music business is a gamble," he said.
